This position is part of the research project "The Explanatory Scope of Generalized Darwinism: Towards Criteria for Evolutionary Explanations Outside Biology" (GenDar), which is funded jointly by the *Deutsche Forschungs-gemeinschaft* (DFG) and the *Agence Nationale de la Recherche* (ANR).
